ADMINISTRATION REPORT

Purpose and Activities

Stockholms Studenters Idrottsförening (SSIF) is a non-profit organization with the aim of promoting interest in and providing opportunities for physical activity. It strives to offer a diverse range of activities for university students in the Stockholm region.

The activities have been conducted in accordance with the association's statutes.

The board is elected by the members at the annual general meeting, held on October 17, 2024. The board held 7 recorded meetings during the fiscal year 2024/2025.

Significant Events During the Fiscal Year

The fiscal year resulted in a deficit of SEK -680,714 (-476,198). This loss is partly due to increased facility rental costs, as well as higher compensation to instructors as more training sessions were added. Despite this, the association managed to maintain operations at a stable level and continued to develop its activities.

The board is actively working on finding long-term solutions to ensure the financial sustainability of the organization. An action plan will be presented during the fall.

A new Head of operation was recruited in the fall. Under this person's leadership, several changes have been implemented, including updates to various policies and a review of instructor compensation (to be completed in autumn). The association's new website was launched in the spring.

SSIF has reintroduced fencing and seen a boost in table tennis, partly due to Sweden's Olympic successes. The club has also expanded into competitive volleyball.

Activity levels across different sports have generally been strong, although sales of training passes did not surpass the previous year's results.

The association had 2,742 (2,615) paying members, and sold:

- 1,244 (1,552) ALL IN training cards
- 652 (946) STUDIO training cards
- 999 (785) SMALL GROUP spots in various sports.

Not 1 Accounting and evaluation principles

General accounting principles

The annual report has been prepared in accordance with the **Swedish Annual Accounts Act** and the **Swedish Accounting Standards Board's general guidelines**

BFNAR 2016:10 - Annual Reporting in Smaller Companies (K2).

Certain activity-related adjustments have been made to headings and terminology in the income statement and balance sheet, which may result in deviations from the Swedish Annual Accounts Act and BFN guidelines. These adjustments have been made in order to present the financial statements in a clearer and more comprehensible manner.

Revenues and expenses from operations

All income from activities related to sports and other programs is reported as **Net Revenue** in the income statement, with a detailed breakdown presented in **Note 2**.

Expenses that are directly attributable to sports and similar activities, excluding instructor compensation, are fully reported under **Operating Costs** in the income statement. Major expense categories are outlined in **Note 4**. Instructor compensation is included under **Personnel Costs**.

Valuation principles

Revenue recognition

Income from participation fees and training pass sales is recognized on a cash basis throughout the year.

Revenue from these sources is accrued at the end of the financial year. Grants received are recognized as income in the period specified by the grant provider for covering operating costs.

Fixed assets

Fixed assets are reported at acquisition cost less scheduled depreciation, based on an assessment of the assets' useful life.

Depreciation has thus been carreed out in accordance with the following:

Not 2 Operating income

Operating income refers to revenue generated from the association's various sports activities. This mainly includes income from training passes (**All-in** and **Studio**) as well as courses (**Small Group Training**).
